Ohio Means Jobs Seal

Meet the requirements and criteria established for the readiness seal, including demonstration of work-readiness and professional competencies.



Seal of Biliteracy

Meet the requirements and criteria, including proficiency requirements on assessments in a world language and English.



Industry-Recognized Credential Seal

Earn a 12-point approved industry-recognized credential or group of credentials totaling 12 points in a single career field.



College-Ready Seal

Earn remediation-free scores on the ACT or SAT.



Military Enlistment Seal

Provide evidence that a student has enlisted in a branch of the U.S. Armed Forces; or participate in an approved JROTC program.



Citizenship Seal

A student can:

- ❑ Earn a score of proficient "3" or higher on both the American History and American Government end-of-course exams;
- ❑ Earn a final course grade equivalent to a "B" or higher in American History and Government
- ❑ Earn a score that is at least equivalent to proficient "2" on approved Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate exams ; or
- ❑ Earn a final course grade that is equivalent to a "B" or higher in an appropriate class taken through the College Credit Plus program.



Science Seal

A student can:

- ❑ Earn a proficient "3" or higher on the Biology end-of-course exam;
- ❑ Earn a final course grade equivalent to a "B" or higher in an advanced science course.
- ❑ Earn a score that is at least equivalent to proficient "2" on appropriate Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate exams; or
- ❑ Earn a final course grade that is equivalent to a "B" or higher in an appropriate class taken through the College Credit Plus program.



Honors Diploma Seal

Earn all but one of six Honors Diplomas outlined below:

- ❑ Academic Honors Diploma
- ❑ International Baccalaureate Honors Diploma
- ❑ Career-Tech Honors Diploma
- ❑ STEM Honors Diploma
- ❑ Arts Honors Diploma
- ❑ Social Science and Civic Engagement Honors Diploma



Technology Seal

A student can:

- ❑ Earn a score that is at least equivalent to proficient "2" on an appropriate Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate Exam;
- ❑ Earn a final course grade that is equivalent to a "B" or higher in an appropriate class taken through the College Credit Plus program; or
- ❑ Complete a course offered through the district or school that meets guidelines developed by the Department.

Garaway School District Local Defined Seals

(Choose at Least One)

In addition to earning at least one state seal, each student is required to earn at least one local seal. The following three seals need to be approved by the Garaway Board of Education to meet the requirements for graduation.



Community Service Seal

The Garaway School District believes that high-quality community service experiences help prepare students for success in the workplace by allowing them to apply academic and technical skills in a real-life setting. Community service also connects students with the community in a positive way and teaches them to become good citizens.

Students must complete the following requirements to achieve the Community Service Seal:

- ☐ Students must complete a total of 40 volunteer hours while enrolled in grades 9-12 **and...**
- ☐ Students must choose to volunteer at a non-profit organization(s) (such as those listed on the Tuscarawas County United Way website) or have approval from their administrator/counselor prior to starting their hours. **And...**
- ☐ Students will document their hours and have the hours verified by the volunteer coordinator/supervisor *(no relatives can verify their activities)*.



Fine/Performing Arts Seal

The Garaway School District believes that participation in fine and performing arts programs supports the development of critical skills such as creativity, sensory processing, communication, problem-solving, cultural awareness, and expression. It also helps students gain confidence that will assist them throughout life.

Students must complete the following requirements to achieve the Fine and Performing Arts Seal.

- ☐ Earn 1 credit of fine arts required for graduation **and...**
- ☐ Earn one of the following:
 - ☐ Participate in a public performance/presentation/exhibition, **or**
 - ☐ Earn a second (Full) credit in the area of Fine and Performing Arts, **or**
 - ☐ Forty hours of documented time on Fine and Performing Arts activities outside of class time.



Student Engagement Seal

The Garaway School District believes that meaningful participation in Board-approved extracurricular activities helps to develop well rounded students who are more engaged in the school community.

Students must complete the following requirements to achieve the Student Engagement Seal: (Students must participate in, and complete an activity that has a connection to the school district they are attending.)

Activities may include the following but not limited to:

- ☐ Extra-curricular athletics
- ☐ Extra-curricular activities/clubs
- ☐ Mentoring/tutoring in the school district
- ☐ Volunteering as a classroom, office, custodial, or other helper (during non-academic time).
- ☐ Participating in co-curricular activities (such as clubs with weekly/monthly meetings).

Activities will be categorized by hours of involvement.

- ☐ Major activities will equal 40 hours or more (such as a sports team with regular practice).
- ☐ Minor activities will equal less than 40 hours.
- ☐ Activity designations will be up to individual district determinations

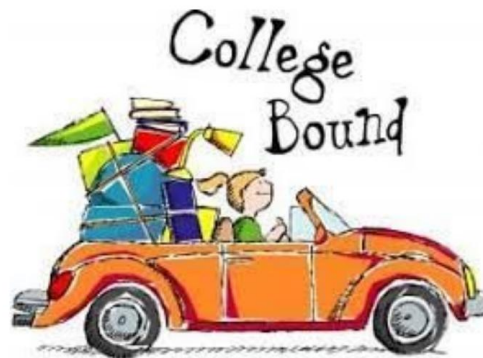

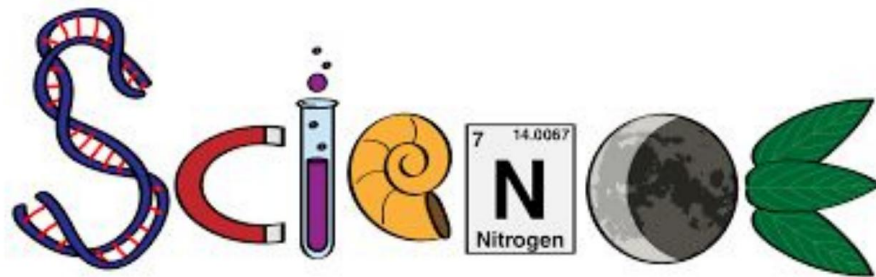
